Rescue Spotlight: 'AA' Place for Dogs

Often, a significant barrier for addicts entering rehab is the cost and perceived unavailability of quality are for their fourlegged companions. 'AA' Place for Dogs is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that assists addicts by easing the burden and fear of entering rehab and leaving their valued four-legged family members. We offer support for the care of that animal while the owner is in rehab.

While a participant attends an in-patient rehab program, we use our partner local kennels to board their pet. A typical rehab stay averages 28 to 30 days. Our kennel providers are wonderful at keeping the owners updated as to their pet's status during this time. Because of this, using kennels provides the participant with the confidence that their pets are well taken care of, which eases the participants' concerns, allowing them to focus on obtaining sobriety. If the animal would need medical attention while at the kennel, vets are accessible either at the kennel or close by to offer that additional support, should it arise.

Volunteer Spotlight:

Dave & Colleen Kadavy

Where did you first learn about Lincoln Animal Ambassadors?

We found out about LAA from our good friend and LAA volunteer Deb DeFruiter. We started helping pickup donations which then needed to be inventoried and put away at the Food Bank. We got a good look at what they do and decided to volunteer. Dave is a very handy and together we did repairs needed at the Food Bank.

Tell us a little bit about yourself.

We met at Cushman MFG where we worked for over 25 years. After Cushman closed, we both went to work for Kawasaki. Dave has worked there 21 years as a Manufacturing Engineer and will retire the end of this year. I was a Production Planner and am retired.

We have been married 37 years. We have two sons. Bob and Mara and two step grandkids Arija and Jordan from Lake Elsinore, CA. Brad and Amanda and two granddaughters Evila and Lilija from Lincoln, NE.

We've had several dog babies. Spike 17 years, Ollie Wallie Waddles 13 years, Cleo 16 years, Vinnie 12 years, and currently Ozzy 3 years and Missy 1.5 years. Our house wouldn't be the same without a dog. We have rental properties and spend a lot of time remodeling, painting and doing general repairs.

What areas do you primarily volunteer for at this time?

We volunteer at LAA Food Bank by helping unload, doing inventory and putting away supplies. Once a week we fill orders and bring to clients' cars as they arrive at the Pet Food Bank. I also like to talk to the clients to find out other needs and bring to them if available. If clients bring their pets, I try to take time to meet them also.

What do you find rewarding in your volunteer activities?

We like working with other volunteers, meeting people and sharing what LAA does for the community. We have people thank us and tell us how much they appreciate what we do. They say they don't know how they would feed their animals. This is very fulfilling to see how much they need us and how grateful they are.



Do you do other volunteer work in Lincoln?

Yes, we both have been part of Woodmen Life Chapter 264, Lincoln, NE. This is a fraternal chapter made up people who have life insurance or annuities through Woodmen Life out of Omaha, NE. Monthly money from each police in our area is given to Chapters to help non-profit organizations like LAA, Food Banks, People City Mission, Foster Care Closet and many more.

Chapter 264 has donated money to LAA and helped buy a new pallet stacker to help unload heavy loads.

Woodmen Life also provides 3 x 5, 4 x 6 and 5 x 8 United States flags to us to donate to non-profit organizations.

What would you recommend to anyone looking to volunteer for LAA?

I would recommend helping with LAA because it is so rewarding helping other people and their pets. Just go online and fill out a form. Find out where they need help. Tell them what you are interested in and find a good fit.

If you could add one thing to the LAA "wish list," what would it be?

More donations. There are drop boxes all over Lincoln. We can always use anything to do with pets.



Stuff the Truck 2024

Lincoln Animal Ambassadors would like to throw out a huge "Thank You" to our amazing community and Super Saver at 27th & Pine Lake for your incredible support during our "Stuff the Truck" event on October 5. It was such a great success!

The following was collected:

- 1,800 lbs. of dry pet food
- 2,270 oz. of canned pet food
- 1,000 oz. of pet treats
- · 267 lbs. of cat litter
- 21 mos. of flea & tick medication
- Pet toys, collars, leashes, harnesses and many other pet related items.

LAA collected approximately \$400 in cash and gift card donations during the

event that will help to provide needed items. LAA's President Mary Douglas said "These donations will help with our fall and winter distributions at our income-based pet food bank. We distribute around 2,000 pounds of dry pet food each month plus canned food, cat litter and other pet-related items. This is a great boost for our program, but our organization works all year long to supply our warehouse with what is needed to help those in need."

Rescue Spotlight continued: 'AA' Place for Dogs

I want you to know that I was deeply touched, and I've told many people about you and they can't believe that you paid for the entire bill which I could of never afforded. I've been sober for 50 days and I feel great! I'm excited about living the rest of my life alcohol free. Thank you again for your love and support! I will never forget you!" - November 2023

"I was lost in a nightmare killing myself slowly, sometimes quickly and I didn't see a way out. As everything was burning down around me a solution was offered to me, but at a price. The price was my best friend. I was facing the choice of punishing the one thing that had kept me going by endangering my dog's wellbeing when he hadn't done anything but love me and give me a reason to live. That was a price I couldn't pay. AA Place for Dogs were the only people that actually helped me to save my life. I had been hit with Narcan twice the year before and overdosed alone in my own house once. Them taking the

moral quandary out of the equation was the only reason I was able to seek out the help I needed to save my life. Because I wasn't able to punish my dog who had never done anything except lay down next to an overdosed kid on the floor until he woke up, to give me more love. To save my own life was to be a better friend to my dog, to give him a better life. AA Place for Dogs understands on a personal level that addicts are people who love their animals as much as anyone and care enough to do the work to help people who may not be able to help themselves. They care about making sure you not only get help but can stay there without worrying about your dog when you have to be focused on saving your own life. They helped to save my life without even knowing me and they are willing to help you too." - July 2023


Grant Writer
